1. CEFNDIR

Mae Cwlwm yn tynnu ynghyd y pum prif sefydliad gofal plant yng Nghymru i ddarparu gwasanaeth dwyieithog integredig sy'n sicrhau'r canlyniadau gorau posibl i blant a theuluoedd ar draws Cymru yn unol â dull 'system-gyfan' Llywodraeth Cymru.

Mae Cwlwm - prosiect a arweinir gan Mudiad Meithrin mewn partneriaeth â Clybiau Plant Cymru Kids' Clubs, NDNA Cymru, PACEY Cymru a Blynnyddoedd Cynnar Cymru (Wales PPA yn flaenorol) - yn tynnu ynghyd y gallu, ar sail cyfoeth o brofiad, i fynd i'r afael â materion yn y sector Gofal Plant a Gwaith Chwarae. Mae'r materion hyn yn cynnwys, ymhlið pethau eraill, cynaliadwyedd, datblygu'r gweithlu a bylchau yn y ddarpariaeth gofal plant, yn enwedig yng nghyswilt gofal plant/chwarae trwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg a darpariaeth mewn ardaloedd gwledig. Trwy gydweithio mae'r prosiect yn llwyddo i ganfod atebion arloesol i gyfleoedd chwarae a gofal plant hyblyg a gofal cofleidiol, er mwyn diwallu anghenion rhieni a theuluoedd ym mhob rhan o Gymru.

Mae Cwlwm yn cynnig dull amlasiantaeth integredig a dwyieithog o ddatblygu, cefnogi, cynghori a hyfforddi. Mae'r dull cydlynus a strategol hwn o weithredu yn sicrhau y ceir cysondeb o ran ansawdd ac arbedion effeithlonrwydd o ran darparu cymorth ac arweiniad ac mae'n cyflwyno atebion arloesol i ddiwallu anghenion lleol.

Mae Cwlwm:

- yn gweithio ar **lefel Cymru gyfan** i gynnig cymorth (gan gynnwys cymorth busnes), arweiniad a chyngor i leoliadau gofal plant a gwaith chwarae, gyda'r nod o gynnal darpariaeth.
- yn archwilio anghenion **datblygu'r gweithlu** gofal plant a gwaith chwarae ac yn gweithio ar y cyd i ddarparu cyfleoedd i ddiwallu anghenion y gweithlu hwnnw o ran hyfforddiant.
- yn **adnabod bylchau** yn y ddarpariaeth gofal plant a gwaith chwarae ar draws Cymru ac yn dod i hyd i atebion i'r bylchau hynny, gan gynnwys atebion arloesol yng nghyswilt y ddarpariaeth mewn **ardaloedd gwledig, tlodi a'r Gymraeg**.
- yn cydweithio i ddod o hyd i'r atebion gorau posibl ar gyfer **gofal plant hyblyg** mewn ardal benodol.
- yn adolygu heriau ac yn dod i hyd i **atebion** i'r heriau hynny drwy gydweithio.
- yn **cynrychioli'r** sector gofal plant ar bwylgorau lleol, rhanbarthol a chenedlaethol sy'n ymwneud â gofal plant a chwarae.
- yn sicrhau **ansawdd cyson ac arbedion effeithlonrwydd** yng nghyswilt cymorth, arweiniad ac atebion i heriau trwy gyfarfodydd partneriaeth reolaidd.
- yn cydweithio i **chwilio am gyllid** i wella'r cymorth a'r adnoddau sydd ar gael i'r sector gofal plant a gwaith
- chwarae.
- yn **cydweithio** ag awdurdodau lleol a gwasanaethau gwybodaeth i deuluoedd i sicrhau bod teuluoedd yng Nghymru yn elwa o'r ffaith bod modd iddynt gael gofal plant a chyfleoedd chwarae sy'n fforddiadwy, yn gynaliadwy ac o ansawdd da.

2. CYFLWYNIAD

Ers sefydlu'r bartneriaeth yn 2014 mae Cwlwm wedi creu a datblygu perthynas gweithiol er mwyn cyflawni amcanion dros blant a theuluoedd yng Nghymru. Profodd 2020-21 yn gyfnod anodd a heriol i'r sector blynnyddoedd cynnar, gofal plant a gwaith chwarae oherwydd Covid-19. Yn ystod y pandemig, bu'n rhaid i bob partner addasu ei ddulliau gweithio a gweithredu yn sylweddol gan atgyfnerthu partneriaeth waith rhagorol Cwlwm. Yn ystod y flwyddyn ymgysylltodd partneriaid Cwlwm yn sylweddol â Llywodraeth Cymru, gan weithio yn ddiflino gyda nhw i adfer y sector o effaith Covid-19. Arweiniodd hyn at osod targedau Covid-19 ychwanegol ond unwaith yn rhagor dangosodd hyn gallu Cwlwm i weithio'n effeithlon, yn effeithiol ac yn ddi-baid i sicrhau bod digonedd o gymorth ar gael i'r sector yn ystod cyfnod anrhagweladwy iawn a llawn straen.

Cafodd Covid-19 rywfaint o effaith ar ffocws y targedau gwreiddiol ar gyfer 2020-21 yn enwedig o ran methodoleg. Fodd bynnag, llwyddodd Cwlwm i ganolbwytio a chyflawni'r ddau amcan cyffredinol canlynol (er mwyn cefnogi aelodau a rhai nad ydynt yn aelodau o sefydliadau partneriaeth Cwlwm), tra hefyd yn defnyddio ymagwedd 'sector gyfan' i gefnogi'r sector Blynnyddoedd Cynnar, Gofal Plant a Gwaith Chwarae yng Nghymru:

Amcan 1: Cefnogi a datblygu Gwasanaethau Blynnyddoedd Cynnar, Gofal Plant a Gwaith Chwarae o Ansawdd Da.

Cyflawnir hyn drwy weithio yn y meysydd allweddol hyn:

Amcan 2: Cefnogi gweithrediad polisiau allweddol a mentrau o fewn y sector Blynnyddoedd Cynnar, Gofal Plant a Gwaith Chwarae.

Cyflawnir hyn drwy gyflawni gwaith yn y meysydd allweddol hyn:

Fel nodwyd yn flaenorol, defnyddiwyd 'dull sector-gyfan' er mwyn cyrraedd y gynulleidfa darged o weithwyr Blynnyddoedd Cynnar, Gofal Plant a Gwaith Chwarae, a oedd yn cynnwys gweithio mewn partneriaeth gyda:

- Darparwyr a rhanddeiliaid o fudiadau unigol

Fel tystiolaeth i gefnogi'r dyfarniad cyllid mewn perthynas â Chonsortiwm Gofal Plant Cwlwm, darparodd bartneriaid adroddiadau monitro naratif chwarterol i Lywodraeth Cymru. Roedd yr adroddiadau hyn yn cynnwys tystiolaeth ansoddol a meintiol i gefnogi'r meysydd gwaith a gyflawnwyd gan Cwlwm. Roedd yr Adroddiad Monitro yn cynnwys pedair rhan:

1. Gwybodaeth fonitro ar gyflawniad gwaith **unigol** y 5 mudiad yn ymwneud â thargedau a gwaith Cwlwm yn unig.
2. Gwybodaeth fonitro ar waith strategol partneriaid Cwlwm **ar y cyd** e.e. gwaith yn ymwneud â pholisi Llywodraeth Cymru.
3. Gwybodaeth am waith dyddiol partneriaid Cwlwm.
4. Gwybodaeth ar waith a gyflawnir gan bartneriaid Cwlwm, sy'n cael ei gyllido gan ffynonellau eraill e.e. grantiau sirol, cyllid ychwanegol gan Lywodraeth Cymru, h.y. Swyddog Datblygu'r Cyfnod Sylfaen. Roedd yr wybodaeth yma yn dangos y gwaith ychwanegol a gyflawnwyd tu hwnt i gyllid Cwlwm gan esbonio'n glir i gyllidwyr eraill sut roedd eu cyfraniadau ariannol nhw yn cyfrannu at a chyfoethogi gwaith y sector.

Bydd hyn yn caniatáu i'r holl randdeiliaid allweddol gyfeirio darparwyr gofal plant a gwaith chwarae at y gefnogaeth berthnasol, er mwyn sicrhau bod y gefnogaeth mewn lle i'w busnesau sefydlu, datblygu a thyfu'n gynaliadwy.	Mynychodd bartneriaid Cwlwm sawl cyfarfod o'r Grŵp Tasg a Gorffen Cefnogaeth Busnes. Yn ystod y cyfarfodydd casglwyd gwybodaeth o'r sector am faint o gefnogaeth busnes oedd ar gael, ac ar ba lefel. Arweiniodd y gwaith hwn at ddatblygiad tudalen we 'Busnes Cymru', bydd yn cael ei lansio yn haf 2021. Bydd y safle we yn rhoi mynediad cyflym ac effeithiol i'r sector at gefnogaeth, gan eu galluogi hwy i ddatblygu a thyfu eu busnesau'n gynaliadwy.

O ganlyniad i'r pandemig bu oediad yn y gwaith o ddatblygu argymhellion Llywodraeth Cymru yn unol â'r adolygiad SGC. Ar ran Cwlwm, daliodd PACEY Cymru i weithio gyda Llywodraeth Cymru i gefnogi datblygiad y Cynllun Cymeradwyaeth Gwirfoddol (VAS) diwygiedig (a elwir weithiau'r cynllun Nanis). Datblygwyd a hyrwyddwyd digwyddiadau ymgynghori a threfnwyd arolwg i gywain barn y sawl ag effeithiwyd gan newidiadau i'r cynllun Nanis. Yn dilyn cysylltiad â'r sector, cyflwynodd PACEY Cymru ymateb i'r ymgynghoriad ar y cynllun nanis newydd ym mis Tachwedd 2020. Ers rhoi'r cynllun nanis newydd ar waith mae PACEY Cymru wedi gweithio ar gynllun o ddiweddarriadau i'w rhannu â'r sector fydd yn adlewyrchu'r newidiadau o 1.4.2021 ymlaen.

1. BACKGROUND

Cwlwm brings together the five leading childcare organisations in Wales to deliver a bilingual integrated service that ensures the best possible outcomes for children and families across Wales within the Welsh Government's 'whole-system' approach.

Cwlwm, led by Mudiad Meithrin in partnership with Clybiau Plant Cymru Kids' Clubs (CPCKC), National Day Nurseries Association (NDNA Cymru), Professional Association for Childcare and Early Years (PACEY Cymru) and Early Years Wales brings together the ability, based on a wealth of experience, to tackle issues within the Childcare and Playwork sector. These include but are not restricted to: sustainability, workforce development and gaps in childcare provision, especially as far as Welsh-medium childcare/play and provision in rural areas are concerned. By working together, innovative solutions to flexible childcare and play opportunities, and wrap-around care to meet the needs of parents and families in all parts of Wales is achieved.

Cwlwm brings a multi-agency integrated and bilingual approach to development, support, advice, and training. This co-ordinated strategic approach ensures consistency in quality and efficiencies in support, guidance and delivers innovative solutions to local needs.

Cwlwm:

- Works on a **Wales wide basis**, to offer support, including business support, guidance and advice to Childcare and Playwork settings, with the aim of sustaining provision.
- Examines the **development** needs of the Childcare and Playwork **workforce** and works collaboratively to provide opportunities to fulfil their training needs.
- **Identifies gaps** in Childcare and Playwork provision across Wales and finds solutions to those gaps, including innovative solutions around **rurality, poverty, and the Welsh language**.
- Works together, to establish the best possible solutions for **flexible childcare** in any one locality.
- Reviews challenges and discovers **solutions** to those challenges by working co-operatively.
- **Represents** the childcare sector on local, regional, and national committees concerned with childcare and play.
- Through regular partnership meetings, ensures **consistency in quality and efficiencies** in support, guidance, and solutions to challenges.
- Works together to **seek funding** to enhance the support and resources available to the Childcare and Playwork sector.
- **Works collaboratively** with Local Authorities and Family Information Services to ensure families in Wales benefit from accessing affordable, sustainable and high-quality childcare and play opportunities.

2. INTRODUCTION

Since the formation of the partnership in 2014, Cwlwm has established and developed a strong and successful working relationship in order to achieve objectives for children and families in Wales. 2020-21 proved to be a difficult and challenging time for the early years, childcare and playwork sector due to Covid-19. During the pandemic, all partners had to drastically modify their working and operating methods reinforcing Cwlwm's excellent working partnership. During the year Cwlwm partners engaged significantly with Welsh Government and worked tirelessly with them to aid recovery of the sector from the impact of Covid-19. This resulted in additional Covid-19 targets being set, however this once again showcased Cwlwm's ability to work efficiently, effectively, and relentlessly to ensure that there was an abundance of support available to the sector during a very unpredictable and stressful period.

Covid-19 had some impact on the focus of the original targets for 2020-21 particularly with regard to methodology. However, Cwlwm were still able to focus and deliver on the two following broad objectives (in order to support both members and non-members affiliated with Cwlwm partnership organisations) whilst taking a 'whole sector approach' to support the Early Years, Childcare and Playwork sector in Wales:

Objective 1: Supporting and developing high-quality Early Years, Childcare and Playwork Services:

This was achieved by working in the following key areas:

- Supporting Businesses generally and in particular in terms of recovery from the impact of Covid-19 and ongoing sustainability
- Focusing on legislative work relating to Childcare and Play, including development of the new Nanny Scheme and temporary relaxations to the National Minimum Standards (NMS)
- Contributing to work related to Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW)
- Assisting Workforce Development and Training
- Supporting Social Care Wales (SCW) with the Gofalwn / WeCare campaign
- Communicating information to the Early Years, Childcare and Playwork sector
- Promoting 'The Childcare Offer'
- Supporting the play sector in funding playworks holiday hunger initiatives by providing advice and guidance and facilitate sharing of information

Objective 2: Supporting the implementation of key policies and initiatives within the Early Years, Childcare and Playwork sector:

This was achieved by fulfilling work in the following key areas:

- Additional Learning Needs and Education (Wales) Tribunal Act
- The National Centre for Learning Welsh's 'Work Welsh' programme
- Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC)
- Curriculum for Wales
- Children (Abolition of Defence of Reasonable Punishment) (Wales) Act

As previously noted, a ‘whole sector approach’ was used in order to reach the target audience of the Early Years, Childcare and Playwork sector in Wales, which included working in partnership with:

- Welsh Government
- Local Authorities
- AWARE
- Social Care Wales
- Care Inspectorate Wales
- Business Wales
- Providers and stakeholders of individual organisations
- Other partners

As evidence to support the award of funding in relation to the Cwlwm Childcare Consortium, partners provided quarterly narrative monitoring reports to Welsh Government. These reports included qualitative and quantitative evidence to support the areas of work achieved by Cwlwm. The Monitoring Report consisted of four parts:

1. Monitoring information on work achieved **individually** by the 5 organisations relating solely to Cwlwm targets and work;
2. Monitoring information on the **joint** strategic work of the Cwlwm partners, e.g., work relating to Welsh Government policy;
3. Information on the day-to-day work carried out by Cwlwm partners;
4. Information on the work carried out by Cwlwm partners, funded by other sources, e.g., county grants, additional Welsh Government funding i.e. Foundation Phase Development Officer. This information identified the extra work carried out in addition to Cwlwm funding and clearly illustrated to other funders how their financial contributions contributed to and enriched the work of the sector.

3. CWLWM'S OBJECTIVES, TARGETS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

For the purpose of this report, the information provided with regards to Cwlwm's objectives and achievements, concentrates on the **joint** strategic work of the partners.

Objective 1: Supporting and developing high-quality Early Years, Childcare and Playwork Services.

Work collaboratively with Welsh Government, Local Authorities, Business Wales, and other key stakeholders as part of a Task and Finish Group to develop a document that maps out business support provision to the childcare and playwork sector. This will allow all key stakeholders to signpost childcare and play providers to the relevant support, enabling them to access the support they need to establish, develop, and grow their business sustainably.	<p>Cwlwm partners attended several Business Support Task and Finish Group meetings. During these meetings information was gathered from the sector regarding the amount and level of business support available.
