Building Blocks Family Centre offer children aged 3–12 years a safe environment after school to enjoy themselves. They have a wide range of toys and games on site and also offer various activities i.e. football, computers, Wii, dodge ball, quizzes and so much more.

Building Blocks Family Centre open each school day (except inset days where they provide holiday care) between 3.20pm and 6.00pm. School collection is also available from local schools in the area with some being Welsh language schools.

Caitlin Gnojek had been searching for Welsh language courses for her staff when she received a promotional email about Camau Play from Clybiau Plant Cymru Kids' Clubs Childcare Business Development Officer. Caitlin stated that the setting does implement a lot of Welsh through displays etc but wanted to introduce more during the day.

Caitlin had good Welsh language skills already and decided to enrol herself on the course to ensure her Welsh language knowledge is still relevant and to "have an idea of the length and contents of the training to see if it would benefit the team."

Caitlin decided to share the information about Camau Play with the team and encouraged them to enrol in order to "benefit their roles."

A further four members of staff from Building Blocks Family Centre have now enrolled on to Camau Play Entry Part 1.

Caitlin would recommend the Camau Play course to anyone stating:

"I would recommend the course, particularly to people who aren't fluent Welsh speakers who would like to get a basic knowledge of Welsh. I like that you are able to complete the course in your own time, and the PDF support resources throughout"
